2. Return the form directly to Student Administrative Services. All information you report will remain confidential.
3. Approximately two weeks after we receive your information, you will receive an estimate of the financial aid we will be able to offer.

This form is not an application for financial aid. It is designed only to give you an estimate of your eligibility. To apply, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. Our code is 003033.
