2019 Graduate Employment Survey Report

For graduates awarded degrees in August 2018, December 2018, & May 2019

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2018 – 2019 GRADUATE EMPLOYMENT SURVEY SUMMARY REPORT

CHANGES TO THE SURVEY:

The Graduate Employment Survey is currently in accordance with the National Association of College and Employers (NACE). It should be noted that in 2015 – 2016, prior surveys were studied and changes were implemented in order to bring the survey in line with NACE standards. These changes were implemented from the academic year 2015 – 2016 forward. The most significant changes were:

- Graduates are asked to describe their primary status after graduation and may only select one category. In prior years, graduates were asked to select all categories that applied. Therefore, all responses add up to 100%.
- The success rate is replaced by the Career Outcomes Rate. The Career Outcomes Rate does not distinguish between professional and non-professional positions and includes part-time positions.
- The response rate is now called the Knowledge Rate. This is change in the title only; the definition remains the same.
- All rates are calculated based on the number of graduates, not on the number of majors.

Due to the changes in survey questions, some areas of the last three current surveys are not able to be compared directly to prior surveys. In these instances, both current and prior data are included and differences are noted.

SURVEY METHOD:

The 2018 – 2019 Graduate Employment Survey represents graduates awarded degrees in August 2018, December 2018, and May 2019. This report showcases the employment, enrollment, or involvement status of graduates as of February 1, 2020.

All graduates were contacted by email to complete the survey. CEEC staff attempted contact multiple times with each "no response" by phone and email. For those graduates unsuccessfully reached, CEEC staff reviewed graduates' LinkedIn and Facebook profiles to determine employment. Finally, faculty were asked to provide data for graduates from their programs (if known), and CEEC staff provided updates on graduates with whom they worked throughout the survey period. Other information, such as Further Study, is stored in the final report. All Deans and department chairs receive the Summary Report and the Infographics.

SURVEY RESULTS:

Bachelor's Degrees (N = 266)

This year's Knowledge Rate (formerly, the response rate) for students earning Bachelor's Degrees is 86.5%.

Overall, for the Class of 2019 Bachelor's Degrees, the Knowledge Rate is **86.5%** and the Career Outcomes Rate (Full Time Employment + Part Time Employment + Further Study + Volunteer/Service + Military Service) is **99.6%**. The number of graduates seeking further education decreased to 15.7% of the graduating class, compared with 17.9% last year.

Employment

All graduates employed full time or part time were asked to provide the category that best describes their situation of employment.

- 2.5% indicated employment as an entrepreneur;
- 1.2% indicated employment via a temporary/contract assignment;
- 0.83% indicated employment via a postgraduate internship;
- 74.4% indicated employment in "all other work categories."

For this year's list of graduates who earned a Graduate Degree or Certificate and indicated full time or part time employment, N = 242. 21.1% of respondents did not indicate an employment category.

Undergraduate Certificates (N=1)

This year, one student graduated with an Undergraduate Certificate in Organizational Leadership. This year's Knowledge Rate (formerly, the response rate) and Career Outcomes Rate (Full Time Employment + Part Time Employment + Further Study + Volunteer/Service + Military Service) are both **100%**. The graduate is employed full time with TriHealth.

Cooperative Education

Of graduates who earned a Bachelor's Degree, **41.7%** participated in co-op. The Knowledge Rate for those who participated in co-op is **91.9%** (102 out of 111 graduates). The Career Outcomes Rate (Full Time + Part Time + Further Study + Volunteer Service + Military Service + Still Seeking + Not Seeking) for those who participated in co-op is **100%**.

Of the undergraduate class:

- 70.3% of graduates were Traditional and 29.7% were Non-Traditional (includes Off-site and Online students).
- 41.7% of graduates participated in co-op.
- Of those who participated in co-op, 86.5% were Traditional and 13.5% were Non-Traditional.

• Of those who participated in co-op and completed the Graduate Employment Survey, 61.8% are employed full time; 16.7% are employed part time; 19.6% are enrolled in further study; 0.98% are serving in the military; and 0.98% are actively engaged with CEEC staff in seeking employment.

Career & Experiential Education Center Services

The Career & Experiential Education Center (CEEC) offers a variety of lifetime services to students and alumni. Among these are assistance with identifying a major; identifying career goals; researching career fields, industries, and employers; learning to write and improve job correspondences (resume, cover letter, etc.); learning and improving interviewing skills; learning and improving networking skills; identifying possible co-op opportunities; identifying further study opportunities; identifying possible Service Learning opportunities; and (for our Non-Traditional students) identifying possible Prior Learning Assessment opportunities.

Of graduates who earned a Bachelor's Degree and completed the Graduate Employment Survey, **48.7%** indicated engaging with the CEEC in at least one of the aforementioned areas. **86.6%** received help in more than one area.

Of graduates who earned a Graduate Degree or Certificate and completed the Survey, **21.1%** indicated engaging with the CEEC in at least one of the aforementioned area. **98.1%** received help in more than one area.
