



ART EDUCATION

In addition to the theory and practice of current approaches to teaching art in diverse settings, the Art Education program offers an intensive study of the visual arts through studio courses, art history, and art criticism. Students demonstrate competency in a variety of art forms and specialize in one studio area leading to their senior thesis exhibit. Upon completion of the Education Department requirements and a semester of student teaching, graduates earn a Bachelor of Arts in Art Education degree and are eligible to apply for the Ohio Teacher Licensure in Visual Arts (Pre-K-12).
