Management & Leadership majors are prepared to manage projects and processes, and lead people in a variety of organizations. Students hone analytical and critical thinking skills, develop business acumen through core coursework and applied projects, and establish leadership skills to bring about organizational change. Students are encouraged to participate in co-ops/ internships. The Management & Leadership degree is offered in face-to-face and online formats. Students may enroll in the 4+1 MBA program (only available on campus) during their senior year. This option enables students to graduate with two degrees in five years: a Bachelor of Science in Management and Leadership degree and a Master of Business Administration.
