After earning a bachelor's degree in Sociology from the College of Mount St. Joseph, Sister Judith worked briefly at the Good Samaritan Hospital and Santa Maria in Cincinnati. In 1974 at age 25, Sister Judy was the only female member of Cincinnati's Police Clergy Crisis Counseling Team. Riding with an officer she was called the "fastest gun" in responding to emergencies. Sister Judy was housing director of WIN, originally founded to empower families to achieve home ownership through construction and rehabilitation projects. Under her and Sister Barbara's leadership, WIN added services in the areas of job development, health care for the elderly, energy conservation, education, and computer skills, as well as adult, youth, and Head Start day care programs. Sr. Judy died at the age of 57 on January 24, 2006.
